10. Result and Discussion:

A). Doctrinal Research

11. Relevant Case Laws:

- i). Ram Jawaya Kapur v. State of Punjab (1955):** The Court laid down the Basic Structure Doctrine, limiting Parliament and administrative powers in amending the Constitution. The judgement in this case, the issue was whether the executive government could run schools without a legislative mandate. The Supreme Court held that though the executive has wide powers, it cannot act contrary to law. This decision clarified the boundary between administration and legislature, ensuring that administrative overreach does not upset the balance of governance or disrupt economic policies in education and welfare sectors.
- ii). A.K. Gopalan v. State of Madras (1950) & Maneka Gandhi v. Union of India (1978):** In A.K. Gopalan, preventive detention was upheld, showing wide administrative discretion. However, in Maneka Gandhi, the Supreme Court overturned this approach, holding that the right to travel abroad cannot be curtailed by arbitrary administrative orders like impounding a passport. This case shaped administrative accountability, directly affecting citizens' freedom of movement, trade, and professional opportunities, which have economic significance.
- iii). Kesavananda Bharati v. State of Kerala:** It ensured that administrative policies, especially economic reforms like land ceiling and nationalization, could not destroy democracy, rule of law, or individual rights. This preserved stability in governance and economic policy-making.
- iv). State of West Bengal v. Anwar Ali Sarkar (1952):** This case dealt with the establishment of special courts under administrative discretion. The Court struck down arbitrary classification, holding that administration must

act with equality. The decision influenced governance by making sure that administrative decisions in economic and legal matters do not discriminate, thus maintaining fairness in markets and industries.

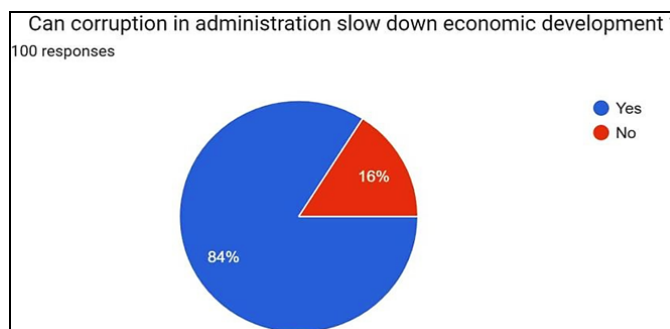
- v). Vishaka v. State of Rajasthan (1997):** Triggered by the lack of laws on sexual harassment at workplaces, the Supreme Court issued binding administrative guidelines (Vishaka Guidelines) until Parliament enacted a law. This case showed how judicial directions can push administration to create safer workplaces, improving labor conditions and indirectly boosting economic productivity.

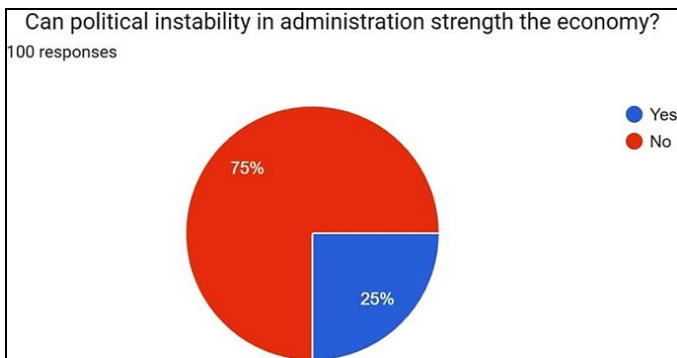

Out of the total 100 respondents, 84 percent agreed ("Yes") that corruption can slow down economic development, while 16 percent disagreed ("No"). Among the respondents, 43 were females, of which 36 percent agreed and 7 percent disagreed. Similarly, 57 were males, with 48 percent agreeing and 9 percent disagreeing. There were no transgender respondents in this survey. The results clearly indicate that the majority of both male and female respondents believe that corruption negatively impacts economic growth by hindering progress, reducing investment, and lowering public trust. 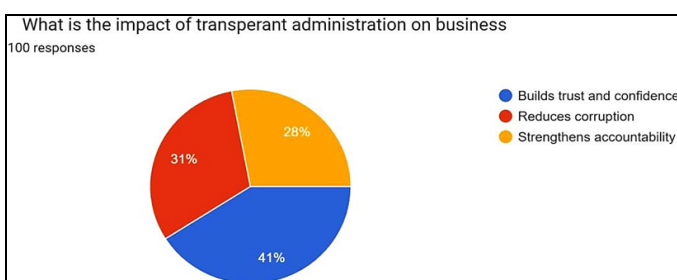

Among the female respondents, 25 percent emphasized trust and confidence, 20 percent highlighted corruption reduction, and 12 percent pointed to accountability. Among males, 16 percent viewed transparency as a way to build trust, 11 percent as a means to reduce corruption, and 16 percent as a factor that strengthens accountability. 12. Testing of hypothesis

- ii). **Transparent administration has a positive impact on business by building trust, reducing corruption, and strengthening accountability:** Table No.3 shows that 41 percentage of the respondents believe that transparent administration builds trust and confidence among stakeholders. This shows that openness in decision-making and communication increases the reliability of businesses and government bodies. 31 percentage of the respondents feel that transparency reduces corruption, indicating that when processes are open and monitored, unethical practices are minimized. 28 percentage of the respondents think that transparency strengthens accountability, meaning that it helps ensure that individuals and organizations take responsibility for their actions and decisions. The hypothesis is accepted.
