"The truth is not always beautiful, nor beautiful words the truth." (Lao Tzu, Tao Te Ching)

These factors influenced his writings as well. Moreover, his poems were like a game changer for the society. Social Reality and Kabir

The influence of Kabir and his poems on the society and its reality was immense. There was a sense of internal satisfaction when one read his poems. It awakened all senses and made one connect with God in a better way. The reality one measures according to the society and what one perceives from it forms as a part of social reality. Sant Kabir had certain ideals about the standardized social reality which was prevalent since ages. According to him, the age old traditions were outdated and required a different outlook if the society needed to progress in various factors. He also believed that the standard of religious traditions should be improvised and built up for the same. He wanted to be the pioneer for change in the societal reformation. He wanted to inspire people to do better and improve in their ideologies and mind-set. Moreover, he thought that this notion will instil the quality of dedication and allegiance towards God and also towards the

main task one is doing and concentrating on. In addition, the other problems in the society with respect to this Sant's perspective are bias, enslavement and domination, greed for power and money, caste issues and many other internal problems. Another aspect he dwelled on is the change in the socially accepted behaviour projected as ideal by the society.

Psychological Aspect of Kabir Das's Poems

Along with inducing a soothing effect and devotion towards God and life, the poems of Kabir Das also produce a sense of a psychological aspect towards the nature of the person who is reading the poem. The mind-set of the person reading these poems completely changes and it develops into the inner conscience of that person. Moreover, the existential conflict in the minds of the people gets resolved when they read these poems. The notion of the worldly conflicts gets diminished when one takes respite in these poems. It also makes us think whether the problems of the present world are really required and what should one do to negate it and navigate the world into a positive place to thrive. Communal disharmony forms the basis of all the problems of the current world. The solution to these problems lies in spreading the message of peace and humanity throughout the world. One of the ways of doing this is through awakening the conscience of the people which can be done by these poems. In these poems a lot of symbolism and metaphorical language has been used which connotes to how one can lead a simple life and live it in such a way that one can be the one with God. The Prevalent theme of Social Reality in the Selected Poems of Kabir Das

For example, in the poem named the Abode of the beloved, which is a translated poem of Kabir Das the lines given below showcase certain elements of social reality.

"No Truth or Untruth Neither Sin Nor Virtue. There Is No Day or Night, No Moon or Sun, There Is Radiance Without Light."

We can decipher that these lines showcase social reality as it talks about the essence of truth in our lives and how one can bring light in one's life if we always tread the path of truth. Without truth the life of a human is like a body without a soul and a river without a destination. Truth is the only driving force which can bring about a positive change in the person following it and also to all if this good thinking is spread by that person to the entire world.

In the same poem there are other lines too which showcase the same theme which are-

> "There Is No Knowledge or Meditation No Repetition of Mantra or Austerities, Neither Speech Coming From Vedas or Books. Doing, Not-Doing, Holding, Leaving All These Are All Lost Too In This Place."

These lines also refer to social reality as they discuss about how no extra effort or information is required to attain the eternal nirvana state or to be close to God. True seeking is what is key to attain this blissful condition.

The poem Between the Poles of the Conscious by Kabir also has certain aspects of social reality-

"BETWEEN the poles of the conscious and the unconscious, there has the mind made a swing:

Thereon hang all beings and all worlds, and that swing never ceases its sway.

Millions of beings are there: the sun and the moon in their courses are there:

Millions of ages pass, and the swing goes on.
All swing! the sky and the earth and the air and the water; and the Lord Himself taking form:

And the sight of this has made Kabir a servant."

This poem dwells about how one can awaken one's conscience from deep inside and reach the epitome of happiness and success which one wants to achieve using the right path and right mind-set. Moreover, this is also a message for the society to brush past all its fakeness and strict rules which are dictated by it to create a false impression as a traditional ideal. It tries to tell the society to be more accepting and adjust to the ever-changing world.

Interesting unknown facts about this Saint-

Although certain facts of Sant Kabir are widely known there are some facts that are unknown to the whole world. Firstly the exact details of his arrival into the world is uncertain. Moreover, the information available about his family is also contradictory and controversial in nature. There is a lot of misunderstanding around Kabir Saheb's birth. Nobody is truly certain of his parents' names or the exact year of his birth. A Muslim couple discovered Kabir Das as an infant, and they nurtured him as their son. This is the one thing that a small number of experts unwillingly concur with. He was never truly born, which is the real cause of this misconception. In the appearance of a child, he came to Earth from his eternal home Satlok. In the Lahartara Pond in Kashi, where the Muslim weavers Noor Ali and Niyamat discovered Kabir Saheb as a child on a lotus blossom, Sage Ashtanand, a follower of Swami Ramananda, saw Kabir Saheb descend to

Also, it is also not known whether he got married or not and also there is a myth that his wife was Loi but this fact is not validated with substantial proof. There is a rumour that he had two children Kamaal and Kamaali but this information is also not verified. There are various stories about how he begot his offsprings without actually giving birth to them. One of the tales is that both Kamaal and Kamaali became Kabir's children when he was challenged by a foe to resurrect these two dead children. At the first attempt he wasn't able to bring them back to life but after a lot of trial in the third attempt he was able to do the task perfectly. This lead to them accepting him as their father and becoming incorporated as his children.

Conclusion

Through this article we have realized the essence and meaning of few translated poems of Kabir Das and what exactly it connotes to. In addition, we also saw what social reality is and how it correlates as a common theme of his poems. We also deciphered some unknown facts about this Sant which are based on some myths and stories from the old generation.
